SYNOPSIS

Crime is classified, counted, and reported in two distinctly different categories. Statisticians and researchers know these categories as Part I crime and Part II crime respectively. Part I crimes consist of those crimes that one may consider to be the most serious crimes affecting society and are comprised of a very specific sub-set of crimes that are routinely reported to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for comparison with other municipalities of similar size and demographics. Part II crimes, on the other hand, are defined as any crime other than Part I crime and are generally considered to be less serious crimes (a secondary level of crime). These nuisance crimes impact on our quality of life.

Part I crimes decreased 1% overall during calendar year 2006 from 938 such crimes reported during 2005 to 929 such crimes reported during 2006. This total represents the 2nd fewest total of Part I crimes in the last ten (10) years. The importance of this statistic should be significant to our varied citizenry. This is also an important statistic for those individuals considering moving their families and/or businesses into our community(s) as it is a statistic that can be compared nationwide against other municipalities of similar size and demographics and easily accessible by those seeking such information in their decision-making process. Down are the crimes of Rape, Robbery, Assault, and Arson. There were increases in the number of reported Burglaries, Motor Vehicle Thefts, and Thefts. The Department had one (1) reported Homicide in West Chester and one (1) Vehicular Homicide in East Bradford Township.

In 2006, the West Chester Police Department documented a 4% increase in Part II crimes. During the calendar year 2006, the Department reported 2,289 crimes in comparison to the 2,193 reported in 2005. The 2006 total of reported Part II crimes is the highest total in the last ten (10) years. Although this figure is not reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for comparison purposes, it is a statistic that affects the overall quality of life for those of us living and/or working in West Chester. This 4% increase in reported Part II crimes can realistically be viewed another way. For

instance, one can say that there were 96 more victims of nuisance crime during 2006. Community sensitivity(s) coupled with proactive and aggressive enforcement of nuisance crimes resulted in a significant increase in Liquor Law Violations, Public Drunkenness, Noise Ordinance, Open Bottle Ordinance and Disorderly Conduct arrests. With the continuing success and transition of our Central Business District, there has been an increased demand for police services. Overall, the police Department handled 4% more calls for service in 2006 compared to 2005 and 17% more calls over the last five (5) years. This increased volume of calls and/or requests for service is a continuing trend. While there is a minimal amount of Part I crime in our Business District, there is an identifiable and increased need for police services. With the popularity of our business establishments and the influx of patrons from throughout the tri-state area as well as West Chester University, the demand has increased dramatically. These issues, coupled with varying and often related neighborhood issues, presented the largest challenge to our Department and community over the past four (4) years. As in 2006, alcohol consumption, pedestrian traffic and corridors, the density and number of rental properties as well as the current environmental conditions, community and neighborhood demographics and the institutional capacity of the police Department to staff and meet the increased demands of its citizenry represent the continued challenge(s) as we move into 2007. The community should be as pleased as I am with the enforcement efforts and activity of its police Department in meeting this complex challenge in 2006.

Traffic accidents reported to and investigated by the West Chester Police Department (with the sub-categories of reportable accidents and non-reportable accidents) decreased by approximately 5% in 2006. In the calendar year 2006, the Department investigated two (2) motor vehicle fatalities and no pedestrian fatalities.

In 2006, the Department continued its efforts towards professional police accreditation through the statewide Pennsylvania Training Commission. The Department continues to pioneer enforcement and programming initiatives recognized by the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association and the Pennsylvania League of Cities.

Lastly, I would like to acknowledge the Mayor of West Chester Richard Yoder, the members of the West Chester Borough Council and the Board of Supervisors in East Bradford Township for their past support and approval of the Police Department's staffing levels. In the calendar year 2006, the Police Department had an official compliment of 46 officers. Several individual officers each missed a considerable amount of time from work for significant injuries and/or serious medical problems.

It is my privilege to present this synopsis of the West Chester Police Department's Annual Report for the calendar year 2006. It is my sincere hope that this synopsis is both informative to you and useful to the various constituencies and individuals we are sworn and privileged to serve.

GENERAL STATISTICS 2006



The General Statistics for the West Chester Police Department during 2006 reveal a 4% increase in the number of calls-for-service over the past year and a 17% increase over the last five (5) years. 2006 General Statistics also reflect that crime reported to the West Chester Police Department increased approximately 3% overall, with a 1% decrease in Part I crime and an approximate 4% increase in Part II and/or secondary crime.

The number of Part I crimes known to our Police Department is the second lowest total reported in the last ten (10) years. The serious crime trends continue a positive outlook for the community with respect to providing a safe environment for our citizenry and our business community.

The increase in calls-for-service, coupled with a 4% increase in Part II crime, (the highest totals in the last ten (10) years) is the biggest challenge for our police department and our community; it has and will continue to impact Part I data (victims and offenders). The Police Department is proud of our public safety service and enforcement in our community. The elected officials and appointed leaders in our community(s) are encouraged to share our collective accomplishments and continue our work in a shared vision and goal for a safer community and better quality of life.

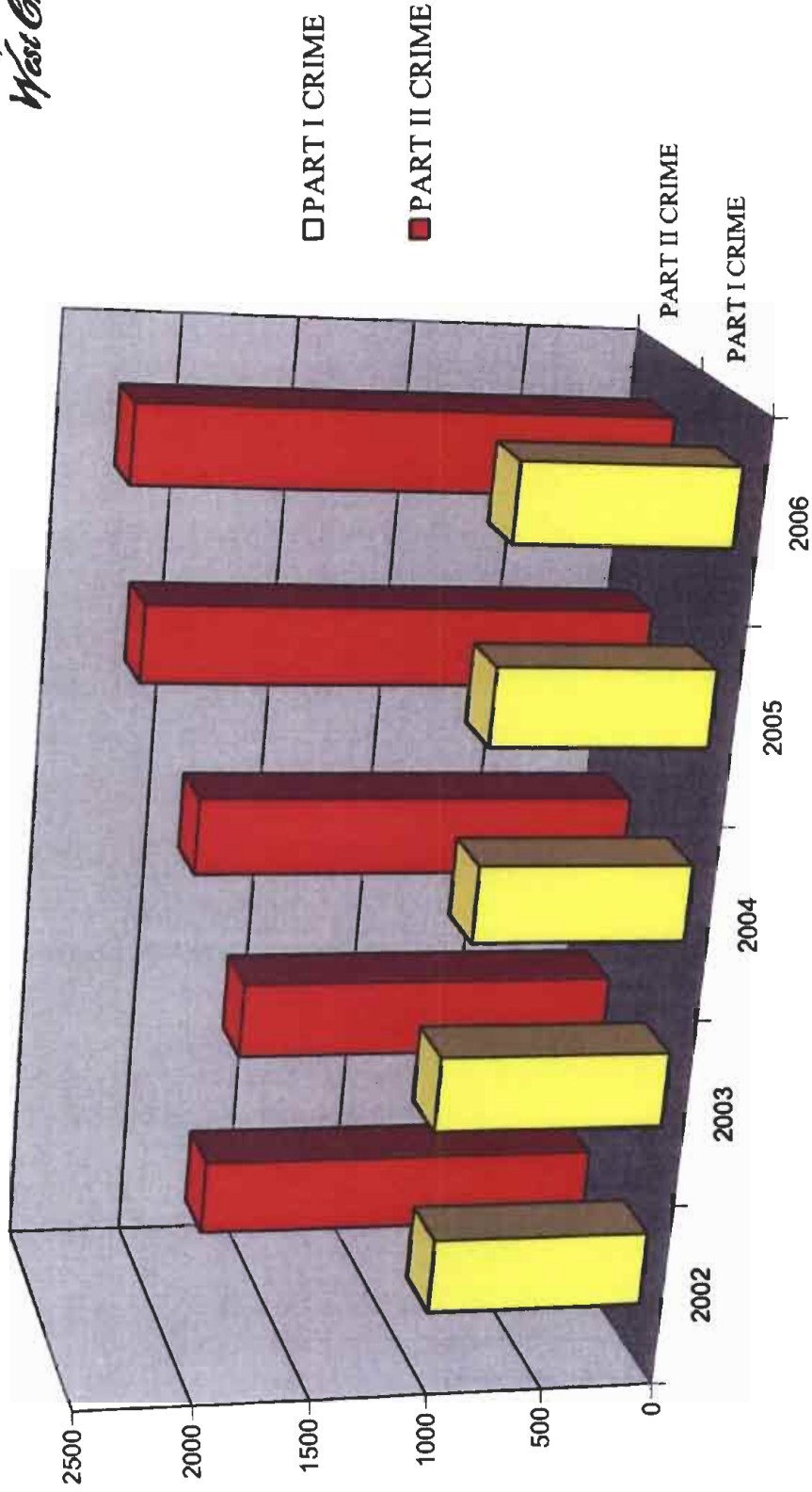

West Chester - East Bradford Combined UCR Data



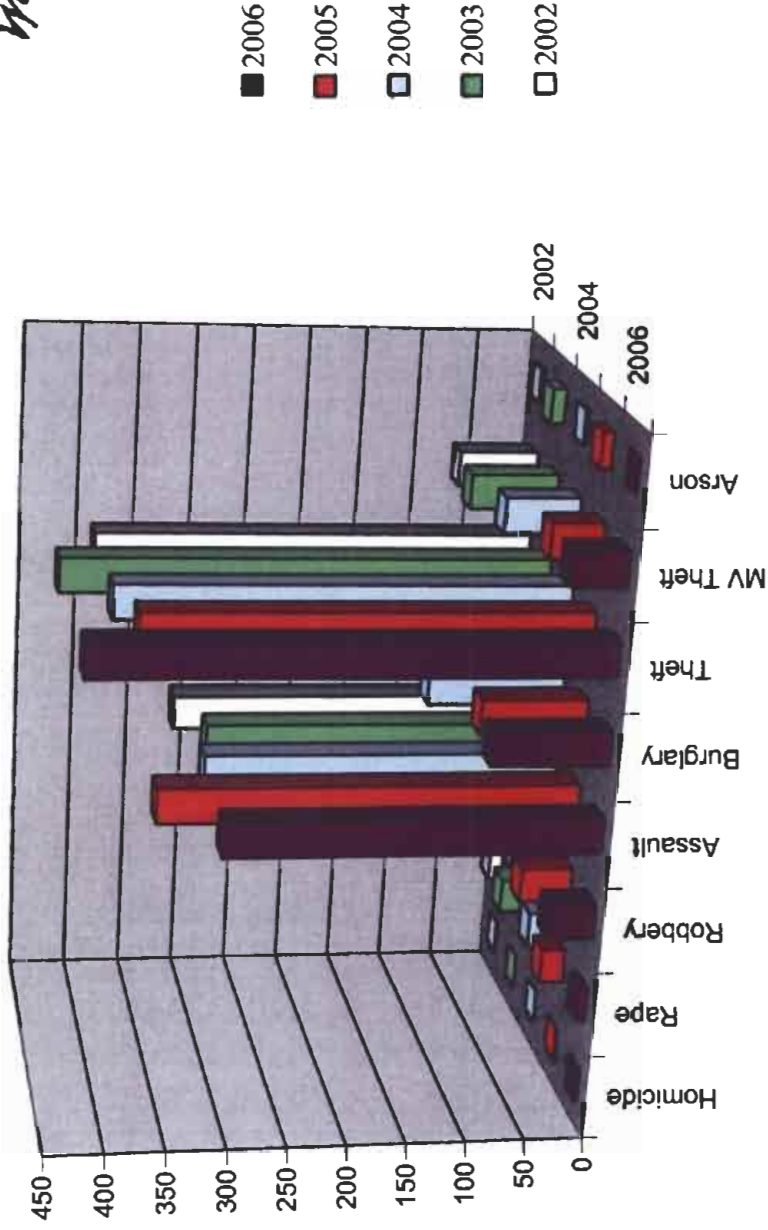

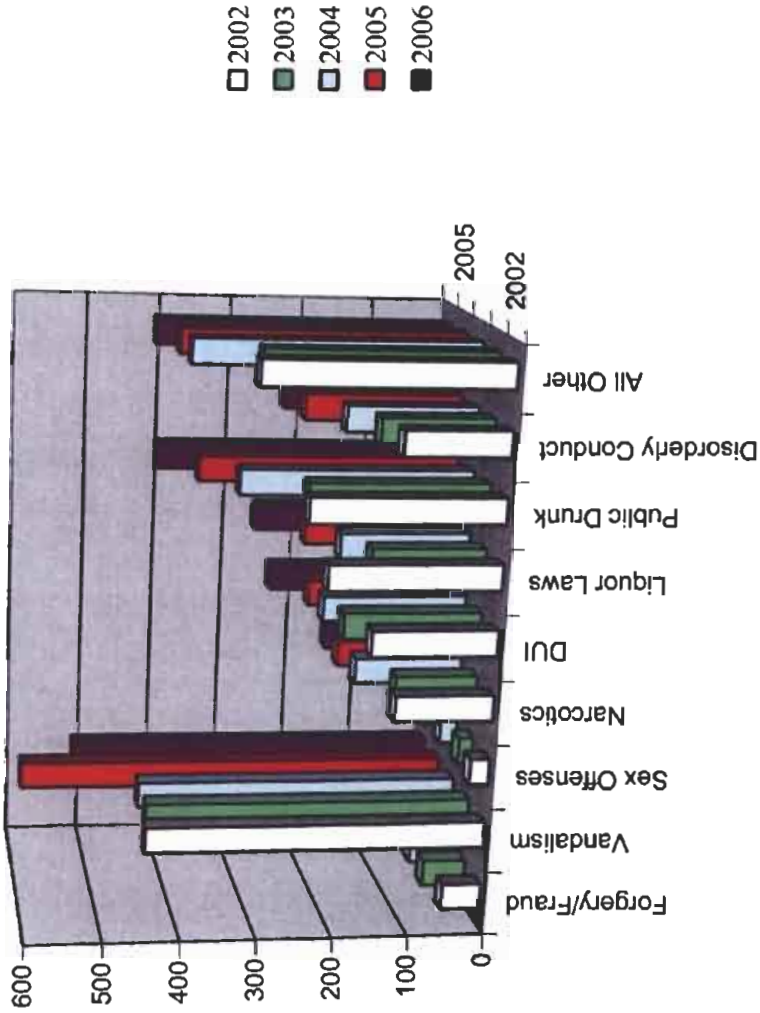

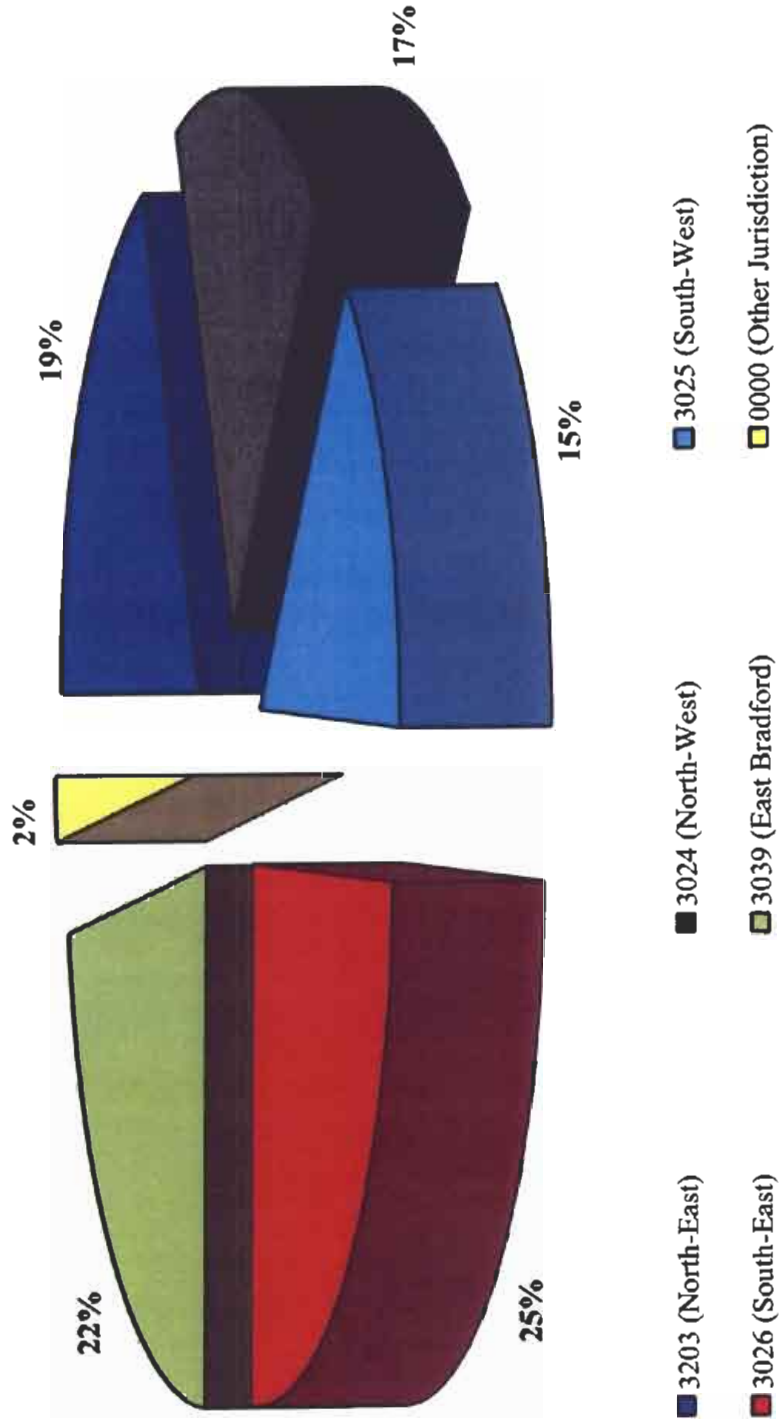
West Chester Police Department Call for Service

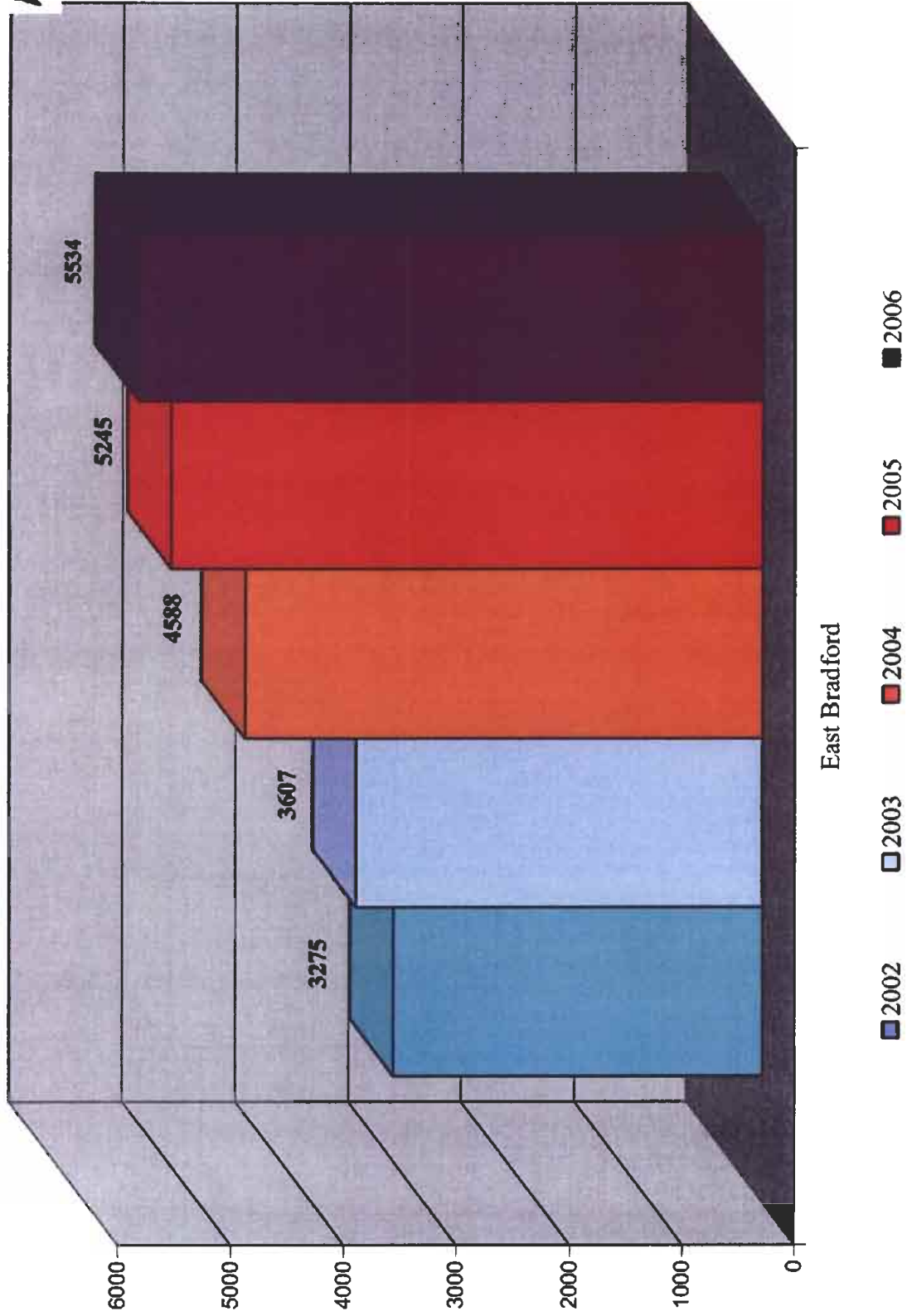

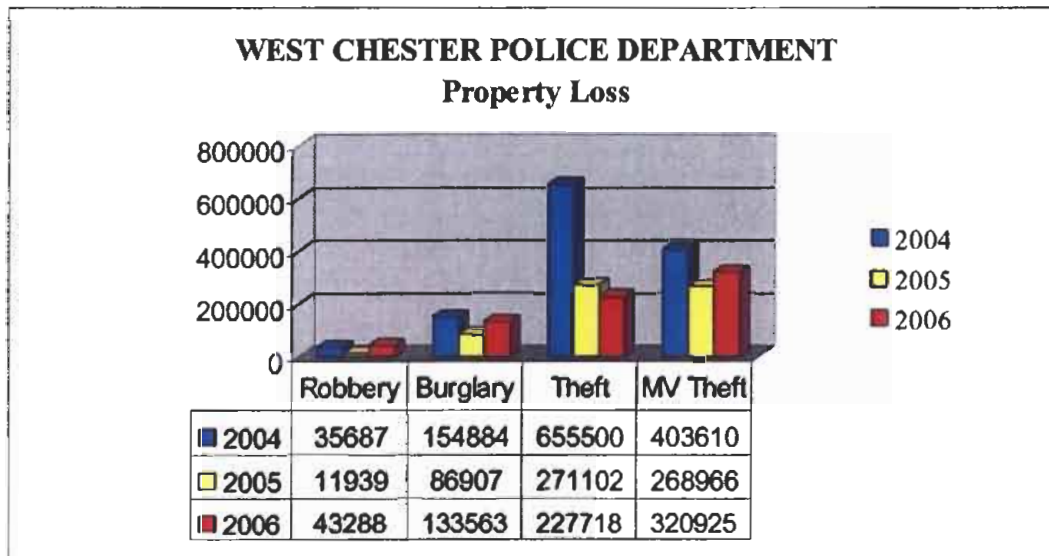

PROPERTY LOSS

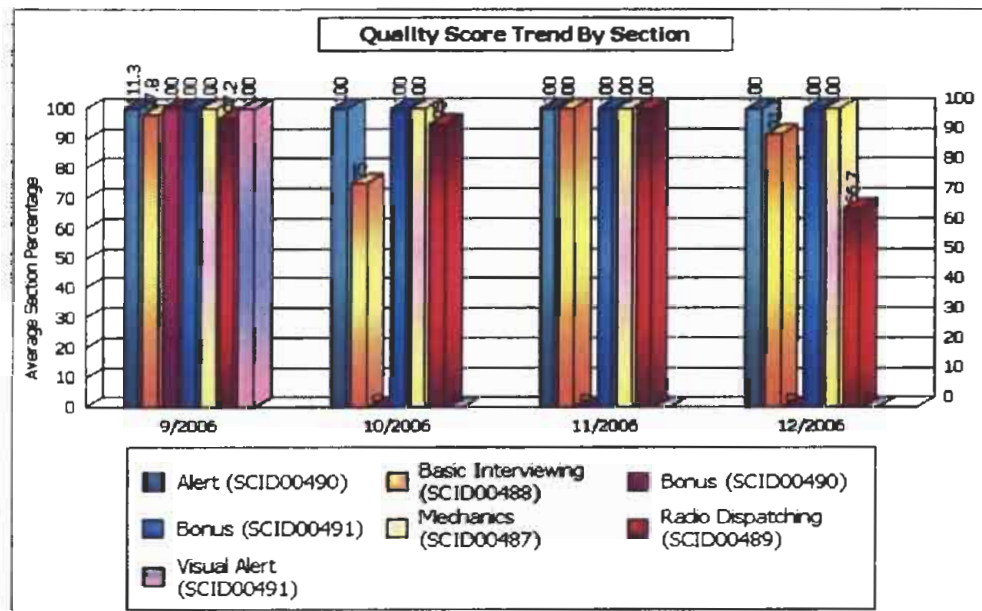
The property loss to residents and visitors of the Department's service community as a result of Part I crime increased by approximately 14% during the calendar year 2006 from \$638,194 to \$725,574, (an increase of \$86,580). This figure is in contrast to 2005 in which the community realized an approximate 48% decrease. During 2006 there was an overall 17% decrease in Part I crime against persons, (property loss) and a 9% increase the values of property loss for Part I property crime.

Police Department Audio Communications Recorder

A new recorder was purchased and installed in 2006. The new communications recorder records seven (7) emergency phone lines as well as both analog and digital radio channels. Additionally, the new recording system has brought an improvement to the Department's ability to complete accurate and timely quality assurance checks of communications personnel. As a result, communications personnel are constantly reviewed and critiqued as part of the Department's continued effort to foster excellent dispatch service to our police officers and citizens. This quality assurance element has also proven to be an essential part for the training process of new dispatchers.



UPS System

At the Police Department's request, the Public Works Department budgeted \$20,000.00 for the replacement of the building's Uninterrupted Power Supply (UPS). The UPS system was aging and unreliable. The UPS provides power to our communications operation, network server and other parts of the Borough facility during power outages. Outages result in hardware failure and a certain financial loss for the Borough in order for repairs. The new system was installed in December 2006. The installation was successful, and the facility is protected by a new UPS system, which should last up to 10 years with proper maintenance.

Computer Network – Technology Report

The Borough network now consists of 4 primary servers and 3 secondary servers. This equipment includes:

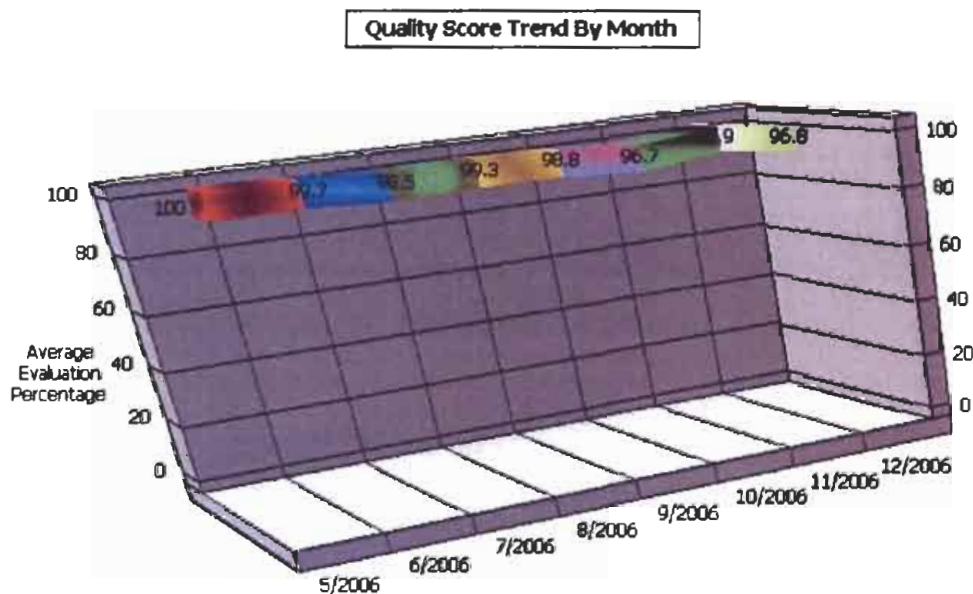
Network Security Report: The network was not out of service during 2006 for any security related issue.

Dispatch Personnel Report

In 2006, the Department was able to secure two (2) additional full-time dispatchers in January 2006: Dispatchers Christopher Jones and Jerry Ferriola. The Department's communications team now has expanded to seven (7) full time positions.

Quality Assurance Reports

The Department's communications personnel are monitored on a regular basis each month utilizing the Mercom Quality Assurance system. Below are the average scored from May 2006 through December 2006.



2007 Planning

The following projects, purchases and goals are planned for 2007:

- Installation of a Motorola Canopy system.
- Purchase and upgrade of Police Department hardware.
- Upgrade of East Bradford Township computer and remote access to Alert.
- Communications training - core training program has been initiated to help schedule training to all personnel.

CRIMINAL DIVISION

In 2006, four (4) investigators, two (2) Narcotics Officers, and one (1) Juvenile Officer staffed the Criminal Division. The Unit investigated 148 crimes clearing forty (40) or twenty seven percent (27%) by arrest. The West Chester Criminal Unit is divided into three sections: The Criminal Investigations Unit, the Juvenile Unit, and the Drug Unit. The Criminal Investigations Unit investigates a wide variety of crimes. In 2006, the most commonly referred cases investigated were Thefts/Frauds, Burglaries, Robberies, Physical Assaults, and Sexual Assaults.

In 2006, the Criminal Investigations Unit continued to assist with large-scale investigations and jointly with outside law enforcement agencies to help locate, identify, and arrest those subjects who commit crime within the Department's jurisdictions. The Criminal Unit cleared multiple high profile and labor-intensive investigations. The following are just a few of the cases described above:

- April, 2006- Criminal Homicide: Phillip Washington shot and killed Andre Newton in the 400 Block of Locust Alley.
- May, 2006- Double Shooting: Ongoing dispute between various Coatesville and West Chester subjects took place in Locust Court where one subject was shot. A Grand Jury was utilized and two subjects were arrested.
- June, 2006- Home Invasion Robbery: Multiple subjects entered 110 E. Miner St and robbed the occupants at gunpoint. Investigation identified one subject, (Eduardo Albany), and he was arrested with the assistance of West Chester Regional Emergency Response Team. DNA evidence has also linked Albany to the gun recovered at the scene.
- July, 2006- Sovereign Bank Robbery: Subject robbed bank at gunpoint and fled the area. Subject was identified through the investigation and later apprehended in Miami, FL.
- November, 2006- Double Stabbing: Double stabbing took place at a large fraternity party at 605 S. High St. Numerous subjects were interviewed and David Walters was arrested and admitted to the double stabbing.
- November, 2006- Prostitution: Numerous complaints received regarding ongoing prostitution at 231 E. Market St. Criminal Unit conducted surveillance details and eventually identified and arrested the leader of the prostitution ring. Neighbors have confirmed there is no longer prostitution taking place at 231 E. Market St.

In addition to the traditional forms of criminal investigation, the unit has and continues to investigate new forms of serious criminal activity requiring specialized skills and training (computer, internet fraud, etc.).

The Criminal Investigations Unit is responsible for the proper packaging, transportation, testing, and storage of evidence received from police officers and detectives within the Department. The West Chester Criminal Investigations Unit logged a total of 610 items into evidence. Of these items, 377 were transported to the Pennsylvania State Police Lima Lab for analysis. The Department turned over \$20,000 in seized monies to the District Attorney's Office as forfeited property.

Narcotics Unit

Summary

In 2006, the West Chester Drug Unit conducted a total of fifty-six (56) drug investigations compared to sixty-five (65) in 2005 and a total of forty-four (44) in 2004. A total of forty-one (41) arrests were made during 2006 compared to a total of twenty-seven (27) arrests during the 2005 calendar year. Approximately seven (7) arrests are pending (ongoing investigations).

In 2006, the West Chester Drug Unit worked various investigations in conjunction with the Pennsylvania Attorney General's Office, the Pennsylvania State Police, the Drug Enforcement Agency and the Chester County Municipal Drug Task Force. The West Chester Drug Unit also assisted a number of neighboring agencies with drug investigations, including the West Coshen Township Police Department, the West Whiteland Township Police Department, the Tredyffrin Township Police Department and the Pennsylvania State Police.

In 2006, crack cocaine, powder cocaine, marijuana and "designer drugs" (Oxycotin) remained the most available and popular drugs used and sold within West Chester Borough. An increase in use and sales of designer/prescription drugs was observed in 2006; primarily the drugs Oxycotin and Vicodin.

The West Chester Drug Unit purchased approximately eighty-five (85) grams of crack cocaine and powder cocaine, one hundred forty (140) grams of marijuana, four (4) grams of heroin, and approximately fifteen (15) units of designer drugs. Crack cocaine continues to be the most prevalent drug sold within West Chester Borough. Approximately fifty-five percent (55%) of all subjects arrested by the West Chester Drug Unit were arrested for crack cocaine. Comparatively, this number was seventy percent (70%) in 2005.

The current price for one "rock"(.05-.10gram) of crack cocaine continues to be between \$10.00 and \$20.00. The current price for an "8 ball"(3.5grams) of crack cocaine is approximately \$150.00, which is the same approximate price as 2005. While other regions within the nation and Pennsylvania are starting to see a decrease in crack cocaine and an increase in heroin and methamphetamine, crack cocaine remains the most used and sold narcotic within West Chester Borough.

In both 2005 and 2006, twelve percent (12%) of all subjects arrested by the Drug Unit were arrested for marijuana. A "nickel bag" which contains approximately .20-.25 grams of marijuana is sold in West Chester Borough for approximately five dollars (5\$).

As noted, there has been a steady increase in popularity among designer and prescription drugs. In 2006, of those subjects arrested, twelve percent (12%) were arrested for the use or sale of designer or prescription drugs. The most popular offending narcotic was Oxycotin. A single pill of Oxycotin (80mg) sold for approximately \$50.00.

At the conclusion of 2005, the West Chester Drug Unit identified the Southeast Sector of West Chester Borough as an area with increasing illegal drug activity. At the beginning of 2006, the West Chester Drug Unit targeted the Southeast Sector of the Borough in an attempt to quell the rise in increased drug activity. As a direct result, thirty percent (30%) of all West Chester Drug Unit investigations took place in the Southeast Sector. Significant portions of these investigations were completed during the first six (6) months of 2006. The attention to this area directly impacted the illegal drug activity on S. Matlack St. The Southeast Sector continues to be an area of concern for illegal drug sales. The Department believes that the intense directed patrol and investigative work resulted in an observed decrease in illegal drug activity in that area during the last quarter of 2006. The Northwest Sector was another area of targeted activity in West Chester Borough. Approximately twenty-eight percent (28%) of the Unit's investigations took place in the Northwest Sector of the Borough.

The West Chester Police Department Drug Unit continued to be flexible with the location and types of drug investigations it conducted in 2006. The Unit conducted joint drug investigations working cooperatively with outside agencies. The Unit conducted investigations that led them into West Whiteland Township, West Goshen Township, and the West Chester University community.

Current Trends and Developments

In 2006, the Department received a great deal of information relative to illegal drug activity at 219 W. Washington St. This activity was of great concern to the residents in that area. The Unit was diligent with its investigation throughout the year. As a result, the Unit obtained and executed a search warrant where various subjects were arrested and the operation was shut down.

The strength of the Narcotics Unit is and will continue to be its ability to maintain an outstanding working relationship with other police agencies throughout the area. As noted, the Unit frequently conducted joint investigations with outside agencies. The following are examples of this cooperative effort:

- The West Chester Drug Unit worked jointly with members of the Pennsylvania Attorney General's Office with an investigation into a subject selling crack cocaine in the Borough. As a result of the investigation the Narcotics Unit arrested one subject for the illegal sales of crack cocaine. The Unit obtained and executed a search warrant on the apartment and safe deposit box of the suspect. Approximately \$63,000.00 was seized from the subject.

- The West Chester Drug Unit documented the increased popularity and/or usage of illegal designer drugs. These drugs include Oxycotin and Vicodin. The Unit was able to gather intelligence and identify a residence in West Whiteland Township as the source of and one of the larger suppliers of Oxycotin in the greater West Chester area. The Unit worked jointly with the West Whiteland Township Police Department and the West Chester Regional Emergency Response Team. As a direct result, numerous buys of Oxycotin were made from three (3) separate subjects. A search warrant was obtained and executed at the residence resulting in the arrest of subjects.

In 2007, the West Chester Narcotics Unit will continue to aggressively identify, investigate, and prosecute illegal drug activity and attempt to mitigate the effects of the activity on the quality of life in Borough neighborhoods.

Goals

The goal of the West Chester Police Department Drug Unit continues to be proactive service to the West Chester Borough Community in an effort to eliminate illegal drug trafficking and use. This will be accomplished by conducting geographically targeted investigations as well as "specific drug" investigations. Both the Southeast and Northwest sectors of West Chester Borough will continue to receive a significant amount of attention from the Unit. With crack cocaine continuing to be the most prevalent drug sold and used in West Chester Borough, the Unit will continue to target this type of illegal drug sale. With the rise of illegal designer drug sales and usage, the Unit will target these types of illegal drug sales as well. The West Chester Drug Unit will continue to maintain strong working relationships with other outside law enforcement agencies; this will help with all types and levels of investigations within and outside of West Chester Borough.

Juvenile Unit

The Juvenile Unit was involved in fifty-six (56) investigations in the year 2006. Sixteen (16) of these investigations were self-initiated. The Patrol Division referred the remaining forty (40) cases to the Juvenile Office. The self initiated cases included:

Juvenile Referrals

In 2006 there were forty-nine (49) Juvenile Allegation Forms filed with the Chester County Juvenile Probation Department. The Juvenile Office filed six (6) of these and assisted in another fourteen (14). The remaining twenty-nine (29) were completed by Patrol Division or the Criminal Investigations Unit. The Juvenile Unit acted as a liaison between the Probation Department and the Police Department and provided juvenile training and updates for all personnel.

DARE

The Juvenile Unit coordinates the Department's Drug Awareness and Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) Program. In 2006, the D.A.R.E. Program was taught in three (3) elementary schools: East Bradford, Hillsdale and St. Agnes. Four (4) officers taught the program this past year. The elementary program was taught to 255 fifth graders. Officer Nancy Martin taught the follow-up seventh grade program to 51 seventh graders at St. Agnes Elementary School. The Department continues to host a year-end picnic for all fifth grade students at The West End Swim Club. The Juvenile Officer coordinates and runs the picnic as well as coordinates the three school graduations. The D.A.R.E. Program is primarily funded through a grant from PCCD (Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency). The Juvenile Officer helps write the grant in

conjunction with several other local police departments and it is submitted to the state as one large, countywide grant.

PAL

In 2006, Officer Martin was a member of the Board of Directors of the Police Athletic League (PAL) of Greater West Chester. PAL hosted its Annual Auction in March, where Officer Martin was co-host. PAL ended the year without an Executive Director, so the Board Members were very involved in PAL's day-to-day activities.

The Juvenile Unit attended monthly meetings in West Goshen sponsored by The Child Abuse Unit in conjunction with the District Attorney's Office, quarterly meetings at JPO for BARJ (Balanced and Restorative Justice), and met weekly throughout the year with the Assistant Principals/Principal at Henderson High School.

ERT

The objective of the West Chester Regional Emergency Response Team (ERT) and its primary responsibility is to provide and maintain a specially trained unit to resolve those incidents generally beyond the normal scope of regular patrol personnel and equipment.

Personnel:

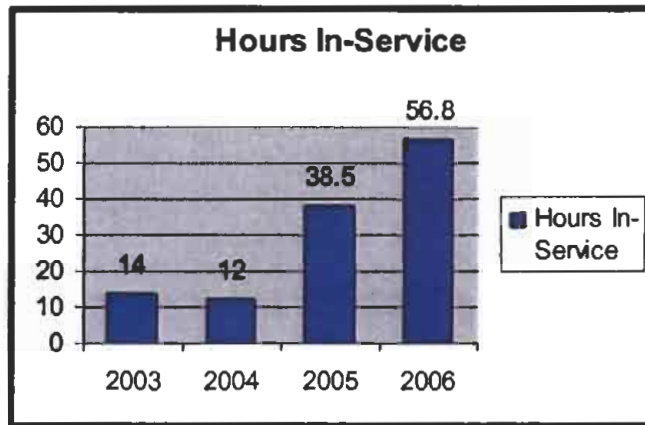
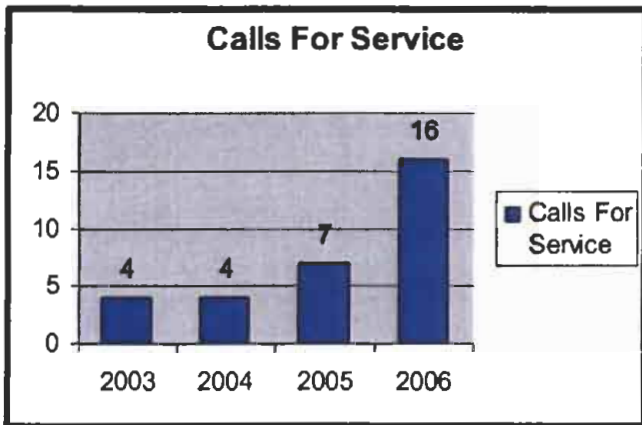
In 2006, the West Chester Regional ERT was comprised of thirty-nine (39) well-trained police officers from seven (7) separate jurisdictions: West Chester (10), West Goshen (8), Westtown-East Goshen (9), Easttown (2), Uwchlan (3), East Whiteland (4), Willistown (3) and a five (5) member board of Chiefs. The compliment of officers includes eight (8) highly trained negotiators and three (3) equally trained snipers.

Calls for Service:

The West Chester Regional ERT was activated and responded to sixteen (16) incidents in the calendar year 2006. Each call for service and/or operation was successful in its planning, implementation and execution. Each resulted in a successful outcome.

Training:

During the calendar year 2006, the West Chester Regional ERT engaged in extensive and ongoing tactical, physical, and range training as well as specialized training for individual members and/or components of the team. A detailed year-end report was submitted and is maintained for Departmental purposes. This report includes rosters, attendance records, medical information, training agendas, equipment acquisition (including Homeland Security Equipment) and the specific goals and objectives for the team in 2007.

RECORDS DIVISION

The West Chester Police Department Records Unit is staffed with two (2) full-time Records Clerks. They are responsible for receiving, recording, documenting and storing all West Chester Police Department reports.

During the year 2006, the West Chester Police Department Records Division accomplished the following:

1. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit handled over 4500 Reportable Incidents including Non-Reportable and Reportable Accidents. This documentation does not include the handling and filing of Lab Reports, Evidence Reports, Prisoner Logs and various other reports submitted to the Records Unit. A new reporting system was instituted in the West Chester Police Department requiring Records Clerks to learn additional information prior to filing the submitted reports. Reportable incidents are now being submitted directly to the Records Unit. Each Records Clerk is required to review the information based on their training and submit any incorrect information to the Operations Lieutenant. Based on the reports submitted, the Records Unit dealt directly with the District Attorney's Office, Military Services, Insurance Companies, Public and Private Investigators/Citizens and Housing Authorities. These contacts were in compliance with the Attorney General's Municipal Records and Retention Act and the State mandated Right to Know Law.
2. The West Chester Records Unit Expunged over 90 criminal history files per court order, a decrease in the request submitted by the Common Pleas Court in 2005.
3. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit collected \$11,660 in fees for reports during the year of 2006 for a decrease of \$360.00 compared to 2005. This decrease in records was based on numerous reports being provided by the Patrol Division. This discrepancy was corrected in accordance with the West Chester Police Department policy and procedures. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit was mandated to comply with the State and Borough Mandated Right to Know Act. Therefore, all report requests now are referred to the Records Unit.
4. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit assisted the Chester County District Attorney's Office by faxing and submitting vital information on all requested court cases. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit handled in excess of 1500 files requested by the Chester County District Attorney's Office. These requests include police reports, lab reports, accident reports, and miscellaneous requests.
5. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit initiated a productive way to document and file complaint cards. Since there are duplicate cards, the Records Department files only a single copy of the documented complaint cards, thereby saving needed filing space. The complaint cards are filed numerically with the Coded UCR filed by State mandated standards. This change reduced redundancy in the recording system.

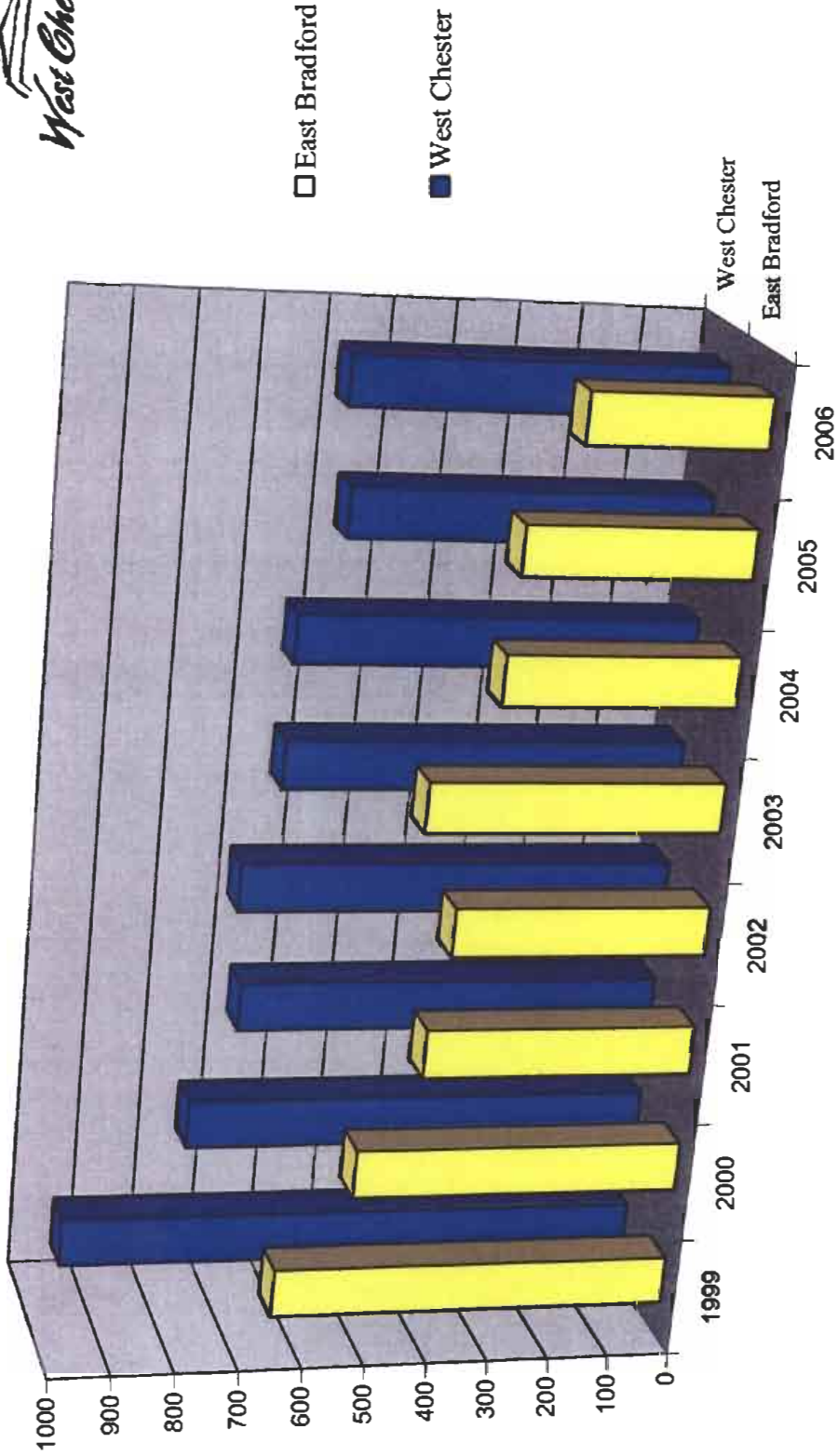
6. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit is in the process of reviewing and archiving old UCR Complaint Cards, Citations, and duplicate incident reports from 2006. The need to archive these reports is evident due to lack of sufficient storage space within the Records Division. In accordance with the Municipal Records Act, these records will be destroyed per request in 2007. This includes court ordered Expungements and records archived per the Borough Records Retention Act.
7. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit continues to separately document all Use of Force incidents in an Excel format. Police Administration can immediately review the activity of all officers. The West Chester Records Unit also files Prisoner Log reports by month and State Pursuit Reports for review. Filing these documents will enhance the recovery procedures in the event they are needed for special circumstances.
8. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit now completes all requested background investigations for the Chester County Housing Authority and normal background investigations requested by Federal, State, and Local Authorities. The Chester County Housing Authority background checks are now conducted with the assistance of the Communications Unit. The Chester County Housing Authority has a Criminal History Computer with a separate ORI assigned to the West Chester Police Department.
9. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit handled over 2145 Non-Traffic Citations and 3,120 Traffic Citations (including 804 Written Warnings). They also processed over 780 Criminal Warrants. These items were submitted to the various courts for additional processing and scheduling.
10. The West Chester Police Department Records Unit now provides information to the Borough Housing Division on all criminal offense convictions. This is in compliance with the Borough Rental Ordinance. The Clerks review the information received from the Court of Common Pleas.
11. Based on the Right To Know Law, with the exception of Governmental Agencies, all reports provided by the West Chester Police Department Records Unit require a Right To Know form to be completed, reviewed and approved by the Administrative Lieutenant prior to be provided to the public.

The West Chester Police Records Unit goals and objectives for 2007 are:

1. Improve storage space by instituting a regular review of records and documents.
2. Document the UCR, Pursuit Reports, and other state required forms on-line.
3. Continue a monthly performance review to determine how effective the Records Division is functioning and to determine the needs of the West Chester Police Department based on records retention.
4. Continue to add old contact cards to the Alert System for retrieval by West Chester Police Department members.
5. The West Chester Records Unit audits reports on a monthly basis to determine if there are any outstanding reports. In addition, the Records Unit will also complete a monthly audit to determine problems associated with reports submitted.

The Department's Records Unit is an important function and serves a critical need in the Police Department. The responsibility of the Records Unit has continued to evolve as the needs of the West Chester Police Department grow and evolve. The employees engaged in additional training to enhance their performance and improve upon their duties and responsibilities.

PERSONNEL ASSIGNMENTS

The current personnel allotment for the West Chester Police Department is fifty-seven (57) individuals. Of those forty-six (46) are sworn personnel (police officers) and eleven (11) are support staff (non-sworn personnel). With respect to the sworn personnel, seventy-eight percent (78%) are assigned to the patrol function to respond to calls-for-service. Of the remaining twenty-two percent (22%), fifteen percent (15%) are assigned to the criminal investigative function and conduct follow-up investigations for those assigned to the patrol function to allow additional time to perform proactive patrols. The remaining seven (7%) are the administration staff in the police department, including the Chief of Police and two Lieutenants, all of whom will from time to time respond to calls-for-service and/or provide assistance to those assigned to the criminal and patrol functions. The following is a statistical analysis of personnel assignments in the Police Department:

When reviewing personnel assignments and distribution within the West Chester Police Department, it is important to consider the information in context. In the calendar year 2006, several officers missed a considerable amount of time from work for significant injuries and/or serious medical problems. Ptl. DiBattista and Ptl. Malicki were hired November 15, 2006. Sgt. Thomas Yarnall retired on June 30, 2006 after 40 years of service. The West Chester Police Department will begin the 2007 calendar with a full compliment of officers.
