SIGN PERMIT FOR LAGUNA MIRAMARE

Carolyn Lewis presented the proposed sign design for the new Italian/ seafood restaurant (BYOB) Laguna Miramare to be located at the former Butter Fish Grill. Upon a motion made by Mary Sue Boyle for approval; and second by Ann Armstrong the Historical Commission approved the sign permit design which will be recommended to the Board of Supervisors at their next meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

BRANDYWINE VALLEY SCENIC BYWAYS

Mary Sue introduced Jim Haigney and Fred Rothman, Township representatives on the Brandywine Valley Scenic Byways Commission. Jim gave the history of the Commission. The Brandywine Conservancy has been selected to complete the Corridor Management Plan. It was noted that John Snook used many aspects of East Bradford Township's mapping to demonstrate the overview for the Corridor Management Plan. Mary Sue Boyle noted that East Bradford was the largest landholder in the Byway Path and many transportation enhancement funding options are available to East Bradford. There will be public participation meetings in the future to conclude the creation of the Corridor Management Plan
